

CCR's Non-discrimination Policy

CCR does not discriminate in service provision on the basis of race, color, religion, creed, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, parental status, marital status, national origin, ancestry, age, disability, veteran status or any other status protected by applicable federal, state or local law. CCR will provide reasonable accommodations to clients with disabilities in accordance with applicable law.

Instructions for filing a complaint: Employees, volunteers, or individuals receiving services from CCR who believe that they have encountered discrimination may file a complaint with the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA), the Illinois Department of Human Rights (IDHR), the US Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) (for employees), and the U.S. Department of Justice Office for Civil Rights (OCR). ICJIA complaint forms can be found at ICJIA's website or by contacting the ICJIA's Civil Rights Officer at 312-793-8550.
